The proposed ordinance would require restaurants to use reusable cups, plates, and cutlery for on-site dining and compostable disposables for takeout as well as discouraging the use of disposable cups by charging customers \$0.25. This would eliminate harmful chemicals often found in take-out containers, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, save water, and eliminate plastic pollution.

Additionally, it would help restaurants save money, with an average annual savings of \$4300, while eliminating over 108 million packaging items and 1.3 million pounds of waste each year. [April 13th: Marin Water's Roadmap to Water Supply Resiliency](#)

In February 2022, Marin Water started a Strategic Water Supply Assessment to drought-proof its supply. The Assessment evaluated the District's current water supply and identified potential water management alternatives to improve long-term resiliency. The Assessment led to a new Roadmap that includes near- and long-term actions to increase water supply availability. The first four years of implementation will be funded by a rate increase. To discuss the Roadmap, timeline, and rate increase Marin Water is hosting a webinar. Speakers will include Monte Schmitt, president of Marin Water's board, Jed Smith, the director of the board, and Paul Sellier the water resources director. RSVP for the webinar [here](#).

On-Going: Ask Your City Council to Meet or Exceed Marin County's "Reach" Electrification Goals!

Marin County's Sustainability Team spent months crafting model 'reach codes', strong, clear, pre-vetted local ordinances on building electrification and EV infrastructure that will let us rapidly electrify the county and move away from fossil fuels. They collaborated with Planning and Building officials of all 11 Marin towns and cities as well as developers, environmental groups and other stakeholders. And now five of Marin's twelve jurisdictions have adopted "All-Electric for New Construction" reach code. **Please continue to ask your local city or town council to adopt these reach codes** to speed action on climate and not wait for state or national action! SB 252: The Fossil Fuel Divestment Act



The Fossil Fuel Divestment Act is a piece of legislation that aims to promote the transition away from fossil fuels, which are a major contributor to climate change, by requiring institutions such as universities, pension funds, and religious organizations to divest their holdings in fossil fuel companies. The specific provisions of the act vary, but the overarching goal is to reduce the financial

and political power of the fossil fuel industry and encourage investment in clean energy and sustainable technologies instead. Please sign [this petition](#) in support of the bill.
