**[Stop the Costco Mega-Gas Station and Protect our Watershed!](#)**

Join 350Marin in stopping what would be the largest gas station in Marin. The project's proximity to a pristine watershed, earthquake-prone land,



and rising sea levels poses large environmental risks. Due to the urgency of the Climate Crisis, we need a rapid emission reduction and recent measures like California's ban on gas-powered car sales by 2035. With this in mind, building a gas station would be a terrible investment. Despite Novato City Council adopting a Climate Emergency

### **Energy Audit and Low Carbon Whitepapers in the Works By Our Interns!**



Our two summer interns, Katherine Ritter and Lucie Martikan, have been busy supporting 350Marin, as well as the Fairfax Climate Action Committee and the San Anselmo Climate Action Commission. Recent projects include creating a Marin Guide to Climate Action, researching for and drafting whitepapers on low-carbon concrete and home energy audits for town review, attending subcommittee meetings, revamping flyers, participating in the Resilient

Neighborhoods Program, and tabling alongside both towns. They are excited to continue exploring their interests in the Marin Climate Movement and supporting some of the movement's key players!

### Urgent Call to Halt Extension of Polluting Ormond Beach Power Plant

The Ormond Beach Generating Station, a polluting power plant in a densely populated community of color in Ventura County, has received an extension for three years beyond its planned 2020 shutdown. Despite its high pollution levels exceeding 94% of other Californian neighborhoods, the state intends to extend its operation again, jeopardizing the well-being of Oxnard residents. Advocates are urging the rejection of extensions for the Ormond Beach,



AES Alamitos, and Huntington Beach power plants, advocating for cleaner alternatives and adhering to the original retirement deadline of December 31, 2023, to end the operation of environmentally harmful gas plants in marginalized communities. **Please**

### **Building Electrification Gains Support in Marin From the Marin County Community Development Agency!**

From Brian Reyes, Marin County Sustainability Planner, "Our appliances and infrastructure must rapidly transition to an all-electric, fossil free future, while simultaneously building on energy efficiency policy and programs. Hence, **the County along with [Marin Climate and Energy Partnership](#) (MCEP)** are in the process of developing an actionable countywide building electrification roadmap that will prepare our community for that transition."



### [\*\*\\$21 Billion in Losses for U.S. Public Pensions by Not Divesting from Fossil Fuels, Enact SB252 Now!\*\*](#)



[A report released by the University of Waterloo](#) reveals that six U.S. public pension funds could have been \$21 billion richer if they had divested from fossil fuels ten years ago. The two largest pension funds in the U.S., CalPERS and CalSTRS, experienced significant losses by continuing to invest in fossil fuels. CalPERS missed out on over \$4.7 billion in returns, while CalSTRS missed out on over \$4.8 billion over the past decade. California Senate Bill 252 aims to require these pension funds to divest from fossil fuel companies. The urgency

for divestment is highlighted as California continues to experience extreme weather events such as floods and wildfires. [Please sign this petition in support of the bill.](#)

### [\*\*On-Going: Ask Your City Council to Meet or Exceed Marin County's "Reach" Electrification Goals!\*\*](#)

Marin County's Sustainability Team spent months crafting model 'reach codes', strong, clear, pre-vetted local ordinances on building electrification and EV infrastructure that will let us rapidly electrify the county and move away from fossil fuels. They

collaborated with Planning and Building officials of all 11 Marin towns and cities as well as developers, environmental groups and other stakeholders. And now five of Marin's twelve jurisdictions have adopted "All-Electric for New Construction" reach code. **Please continue to ask your local city or town council to adopt these reach codes** to speed action on climate and not wait for state or national action!
